

Eurolympics Games



Students investigate what typical local, regional or national sports can be found in their vicinity. They exercise them, describe them in such a way that foreigners can understand and learn them. They try to find out why certain sports are popular in certain regions. They look into the relation between cultural identity and sport and share their results with the other project partners in the Twinspace. During the project meeting, they will organise an international sports tournament in which students from different countries are sporting together and with people from minorities and disabled people. During the project meetings students will use the report of the Twinspace to exercise the typical regional sports from every country in mixed/international teams during a sports competition. They will investigate and discuss the different ways to include every one in these sportive activities. They will publish their outcomes in the Twinspace.

The first step is a personal introduction of every student participating in the project. The students will start working in national groups and work first on subjects in their own vicinity and region. Then they will form international teams in the Twinspace and work on international subjects and discuss their results. The final step will be the gathering of the students in project meetings where they will try out their ideas.
